Georg, an engineer by trade, is detail oriented, always cheery, and known as a finisher. His recognition is well deserved.



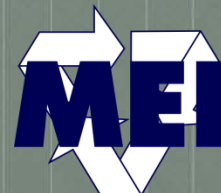
Trent Page awarding Shawn Dulany - Field Services Manager Award
